Hello, my name is Jade Moss.

When I first embarked on my access course, I wanted to become a Midwife but then felt that Nursing was my calling. I studied at the University of Northampton and completed my clinical hours at Northampton General Hospital where I had a range of placements from Opthalmology, Oncology to District Nursing which is where I developed my passion for wound care. My final placement was on a Colorectal Bowel Ward which is where I started my first Nursing position. During my 5 years on the ward, I became the ward Tissue Viability Link Nurse where I trained in additional competencies such as negative pressure wound therapy.

Following this, I applied for a Fellowship – a seconded post to work alongside falls, infection control and tissue viability teams. Here, I enhanced my knowledge within these specialisms and created a framework for change to improve patient harms. The Wound Care Plan that I developed and implemented is now audited and Trust wide and has consequently the use of the Wound Care Plan has improved appropriate dressing use from 24% to 76%. After completing the Fellowship, I continued to work within the Tissue Viability Team and moved into a Shared Decision-Making Facilitator role where I worked closely with ward and departments to improve patient outcomes and wellbeing.

I have always pioneered change for positive patient outcomes, which I why I am pleased to join DHG as Clinical Nurse Specialist and drive improved patient outcomes, pressure ulcer prevention and wound care best practices on a national level.
